

The Bachelor of Theology Program

The Bachelor of Arts Program is designed for persons who are committed to Pastoral or Christian Education Ministry specifically. The BA program requires successful completion of 120 semester hours of course work.

All persons applying for admission are required to have a high school diploma or equivalent. Every effort is made so that those who enter the Christian ministry should be as finely prepared as possible. Specialized studies may be developed through directed study, independent study, group electives, or intensive courses offered at the Seminary.
